

Resolution Adopted by the Daisy
Society of the Free Methodist Church,

1938

Whereas the Daisy Free Methodist Church
building and parsonage being in the
condemned area of the Columbia Basin
project that is to be flooded by the Coulee
Dam and ^{on Columbia River}

Whereas the United States government has
appraised and bought said property for the
sum of \$2025⁰⁰, less the cost of abstract
amounting to the sum of \$48⁰⁰ leaving the
net sum of \$1976³⁵ in the hands of the
Daisy Society and.

Whereas all of the members of the society
living in the town of Daisy have moved to
other places and

whereas R. L. Stewart, Myrtle E. Stewart and
son Eugene Stewart are the only members
remaining in the community and.

Whereas all of the members of the Daisy
Society desire to transfer their membership
to other societies,

Therefore be it resolved by the Daisy Society
of the Free Methodist Church in session at

Daisy, April 29, 1938,

First, that we request the Columbia River Annual Conference to declare the Daisy Society extinct.

2nd That the bell from the Daisy Church be installed for use on the Conference Camp ground.

3^d That the Church pews, pulpit and other furniture, also the furniture remaining in the parsonage be sent to the Conference Camp ground to be used as the Camp ground Committee may direct.

4th That the money resulting from the sale of the Church and parsonage, amounting to the sum of \$1976³⁵, less whatever sum may be necessary to move the fixtures from Church and parsonage to the Conference Camp ground, be turned over to the Conference treasurer Vern L. Damon, to be used by the Conference for the upbuilding of the Kingdom as they may see fit.
